

Mouthguard Policy | Current As At 13 June 2019

At the end of 2018, the Department of Education released new policy regarding the use of mouth guards in contact sports. As of 2019, *all students participating in school-based Rugby League, Rugby Union, Hockey, AFL and Water Polo in Queensland will be required to wear a mouthguard during all games and training sessions.* Schools are also required to provide information about the 3 different types of mouthguards to parents/ carers, to assist you to make an informed choice for your child:

- 1. Custom-fitted mouthguards are considered to provide the best protection of the teeth, lips and jaw. Customfitted mouthguards are made by a dentist or a dental technician to fit the individuals mouth, and provide the best protection due to their close fit, comfort and cushioning (shock absorption) effect.
- Boil and bite mouthguards are directly formed to the upper teeth after the lining is softened in boiling water. They can be uncomfortable if not properly fitted, and provide limited protection. They should be replaced each season. (The uniform shop will sell a limited range of this style beginning at \$11.50. NB Students must follow instructions provided by the manufacturer when fitting moutguards but as extreme care must be taken, students must not fit these at school. Fitting must be done with parent/ carer who also accepts responsibility for this process)
- 3. Stock (ready-to-wear) mouthguards come pre-formed and are the least expensive type of mouthguard, but also provide the least amount of protection, fit and comfort.

The QLD Education Department strongly recommends that students wear custom-fitted mouthguards
