This funding will be used to

- Increase the average student attendance rate to 90%.
- Achieve a differentiated average A-C achievement rate in Junior Secondary of Year 7: 70%, Year 8: 75%, Year 9: 70% and Year10: 70%.
- Achieve a QCE/QCIA attainment rate of 98% for students on a vocational pathway.
- Provide a high quality Junior Secondary curriculum applying the Australian Curriculum with fidelity.
- Provide a Senior Secondary curriculum that enables success in Vocational Pathways and the ATAR tertiary entrance process.
- Provide targeted interventions to improve outcomes for students requiring EAL/D or learning support.
- Improve the school's engagement and communication with its community.

Our initiatives include

- Providing academic and literacy and numeracy support for students through the EAL/D and Learning Support faculties.
- The implementation of a behaviour management strategy based upon restorative justice.
- Provision of digital textbooks and other resources to improve student equity and outcomes.
- Employment of a Communications and Community Relations Officer and Liaison Officers to improve student participation and attendance and community engagement with the school.
- The enhancement of strategies for instructional leadership and improving communication, collaboration and consultation between staff members.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Providing increased staffing and resources to maintain a broad academic and vocational curriculum, maximise student engagement and implement a collegial engagement framework. **\$614 714**
- Providing specialised staff and resources to improve the educational outcomes of disadvantaged students, EAL/D students and students requiring learning support. **\$390 918**
- The employment of specialist staff to improve student wellbeing and community engagement. **\$252 214**
